The song is about these orphans having a family and a Father that will protect them and being reminded that when everything turns to gray and black that things will be okay because God will send his angels to protect them when the lights go out. I have been telling all of the magazines and media interview people about this song and the story behind it so people will see these children and give them homes and to see that God loves the fatherless and the widows.
